**DUBLIN—FEBRUARY 19.**

The Lord Mayor is nearly recovered. The Birr Bank is about to be dissolved, in consequence of which, notice is given by its proprietors, to cash all notes for payment, previous to the 1st of next month.

Letters from Liverpool state, that very extensive operations in cotton have taken place there.

Some prisoners in the jail of Castlebar attempted to break their way out on Monday night, but not effecting their object, some of them endeavoured to burn the building without success—four of the prisoners were severely suffocated.

Mr. Jerminingham, the Secretary of the English Catholics, and brother of the Baronet of that name, has resided in Dublin. He is amongst the numerous witnesses who are summoned to give evidence in the great nobleman's cause. We understand that the leading Catholic Gentlemen of this City intend to compliment Mr. Jerminingham with a public dinner.

Some workmen, in taking down part of a house in Grey-street, purchased by Mr. Manders from the Commissioners of wide streets, found several bags of gold coin, some of them as far back as Charles II.—It is computed that the property found could not have been valued to less than two thousand guineas.

A suit is already commenced about the gold.—The owners have a right to it, as being found in the ground.

A Coadjutor is appointed to Clogher on the presentation of the Roman Catholic Bishop, and against the representation of the Clergy of the Diocese.

**DUBLIN MARKETS.**—There was but little business done at yesterday's Corn Market, the supply of Grain being small and the demand for all kinds very bad. Wheat fell 3s. per barrel, and Flour 1s. to 1s. 6d. per cwt. Barley and Oats maintained their prices, but had few purchasers. Wheat for Millers use, 45s. to 50s. per cwt.; fine malting samples still scarce, and would readily bring 30s.; Oats 18s. to 22s.; Oatmeal, 19s. to 22s.; Second Flour, 28s. to 30s. No variation in Whiskey, 10s. 9d. per gallon the single cask, the demand still continuing slack.

On Tuesday, Arthur Henry D'Esterre, Esq. one of the Coroners of this County, proceeded to Ulla, accompanied by Dr. Raleigh, to hold an inquest on the body of Daniel Ryan, of Newtown Ellard, who it was supposed had been murdered on the 8th inst. and thrown into the river of Bilboa, where his body was found on the 12th inst. The jury after a considerable length of time on consideration of the evidence, found a verdict, that the deceased came by his death by suffocation from drowning, and that he was thrown into the river by John Bourke, and John Howard, according to their opinion. In consequence of this finding, the Coroner thought it incumbent on him to commit these two men (who were then in custody), to the County Gaol, to abide their trial at the next Assizes.

On Thursday last, Captain John Brady, of Rahoon, in the County of Clare, accompanied by his brother Anthony Brady, Esq. and part of his corps (the Tomgrany Yeomanry,) proceeded to a wood on part of his estate, in the parish of Tomgrany, where they destroyed an extensive private distillery. It being Mr. Brady's determination to suppress this baneful and pernicious system of illicit distillation, so very injurious to the public, and also to his Majesty's revenue, he has offered rewards for any private information that may lead to a discovery of such illicit matter being carried on, on any part of his lands.

Tuesday, Messrs. Bolton and D'Arcy, Officers of Excise, detected two Distilleries and three illicit Malt-houses on the lands of Ballykeg, between Corofin and Tubber, which they effectually destroyed.
