DREADFUL MURDERS.—We did hope that our col-
umns would not, for a length of time, have again the
disgusting task of communicating an additional out-
rage in this county, but unfortunately, we were mis-
taken, and have now to mention, that the bodies of
John Dillane, a respectable farmer, his sister, the
widow Costelloe, and her daughter, were found mur-
dered on the lands of Knocklenish, barony of Upper
Connelloe, in this county, on Monday last. It ap-
pears that these unfortunate persons were at the mar-
ket of Newcastle on Saturday se'night, and after
disposing of some pigs, were returning home; way-
laid and murdered; and from that time, though dil-
igent search was made, no clue could possibly be had,
to ascertain their fate until Monday last, when they
were found as thus described, in an unfrequented part
of a mountain road. It is clear that robbery was
not the object of the murderers, as all the money
which the deceased persons received at the market
was found on them. The motive of so dreadful
an outrage, can only be ascribed to revenge, as it is
said the widow Costelloe, at our last assizes, very
properly prosecuted two persons for cow-stealing, who
were convicted.

Since writing the above, we have learned that an
inquest was held on the bodies of Samuel Harding, Esq.
Coroner, when a verdict of willful murder was returned
against persons unknown—the necks of the unfortu-
nate sufferers were broken, and their bodies not only
had the appearance of violence, but parts of them were
mutilated.

Sunday night, the body of Chas. Connors a hackney
driver, was found dead on the new-bridge of Glm.
Samuel Harding, Esq. Coroner, having held an inquest,
the Jury returned a verdict, that his death was caused
by the inclemency of the weather.

ASSIZES INTELLIGENCE.

Since our last the following were convicted in the
County Court:—Timothy Corkerry, for cow-stealing,
and Timothy Feighney, for robbing the Cork mail boy
between Croom and Charleville, both to be hanged.

The only Nisi Prius cause of any import tried in the
Co. since Wednesday, was one to ascertain damages
in the attack on Mr. Vize's mill and concern in June
last—he claimed £570; the Jury gave £200. In the
case of Pim and Goodbody for the pillage of their
boat, lying at the Canal, laden with flour—verdict, by
consent, for amount claimed, £61.

Since yesterday a County Jury has been locked up
without returning a verdict, in which a man and his
sister, named McDonnell, are charged with abduction.

One o'Clock—The Jury have just returned in a
verdict of Guilty, against McDonnell, and acquitting
his sister.

Thursday, yesterday, and this day, the Hon. Justice
Moore and a highly respectable Jury, were occupied
in the Record Court, investigating a case which
excited great interest, wherein John Long, lessee of
James Alton and Frances Alton, otherwise Bindon,
his wife, are Plaintiffs, and Samuel Bindon, Esq. of
Waterpark, Defendant. It is an issue directed from
the Court of Chancery, to try the validity of the will
of the late Samuel David Bindon, Esq. whereby he
devised the lands in the pleadings mentioned, situate
in the Liberties of Limerick, to his cousin, Samuel
Bindon, Esq. the Defendant. A number of witnesses
have been examined on both sides. We presume not
in this stage of so important a trial, to form any
opinion on the result. The case has not yet been
closed on the part of the Defendant, but we propose
to give a summary report of the proceedings. The
