ASSIZES INTELLIGENCE.

Since our last the following were convicted in the County Court:—Timothy Corkery, for cow-stealing, and Timothy Feighney, for robbing the Cork mail boy between Croom and Charleville, both to be hanged.

The only Nisi Prius cause of any import tried in the County, since Wednesday, was one to ascertain damages in the attack on Mrs. Vize's mill and concern in June last—he claimed £570; the Jury gave £200. In the case of Pim and Goodbody for the pillage of their boat, lying at the Canal, laden with flour—verdict, by consent, for amount claimed, £64.

Since yesterday a County Jury has been locked up without returning a verdict, in which a man and his sister, named McDonnell, are charged with abduction.

One o'clock—The Jury have just returned in a verdict of Guilty, against McDonnell, and acquitting his sister.

Thursday, yesterday, and this day, the Hon. Justice Moore and a highly respectable Jury, were occupied in the Record Court, investigating a case which excited great interest, wherein John Long, lessee of James Alton and Frances Alton, otherwise Bindon, his wife, are Plaintiffs, and Samuel Bindon, Esq. of Waterpark, Defendant. It is an issue directed from the Court of Chancery, to try the validity of the will of the late Samuel David Bindon, Esq. whereby he devised the lands in the pleadings mentioned, situate in the Liberties of Limerick, to his cousin, Samuel Bindon, Esq. the Defendant. A number of witnesses have been examined on both sides. We presume not in this stage of so important a trial, to form any opinion on the result. The case has not yet been closed on the part of the Defendant, but we propose to give a summary report of the proceedings. The following are the names of the Jury—William Roche, Robert Hedges Maunsell, William Gabbett, Limerick, John Browne, James O'Grady, Major Samuel Tonkins, Collector Fitz-Gibbon, Alderman Moroney, Joseph Gabbett, Hugh Brady, Thomas Gabbett, and Henry Taylor, Esqs.

The City Grand Jury have not granted any road presentments whatever at the present Assizes.

Judge Moore has announced that he will leave town to-morrow for Tralee, and on Monday will open the Assizes for the Co. Kerry.—The Solicitor General remains here to dispose of the City and County business, a multiplicity of which remains yet unfinished.

Yesterday, Patrick Moylan, who we stated in our last to have been convicted on Wednesday for the murder of Mr Switzer, at Ballygarry, underwent the awful sentence of the Law at Gallows-green, in presence of some thousands. After hanging the usual time, the body was cut down and removed to the Co. Infirmary for dissection. We understand that he acknowledged the justice of his sentence, as every individual who witnessed the trial, must acknowledge that the conviction was had on the clearest testimony.

The poor widows in the City alms-house, twenty in number, return grateful thanks to the Lady of Alderman Frederick Lloyd, for having received by her order, on Wednesday, the timely relief of 5s. 4d. each.

The great Cow fed by Sir Edward O'Brien, Bart. M. P. Dromoland, mentioned in our last, was killed on Wednesday, at Newtown market, by James Jackson—weight of tallow, 9 stone; hide, 6 stone; carcase, 68 stone; measuring 4 inches on the rib, and 6½ inches on the rump—the animal was not long on hands.
