Royal Highness the Prince Regent will embark from Portsmouth in the Royal yacht, when the whole will proceed down channel on a cruize, stopping to examine the Breakwater at Plymouth. It is supposed the Duke's flag will be hoisted on board the yacht, as orders are received to fit up apartments for him in her.

Thursday night, the house of Mr. James Parker, on Lord Clarina's estate, Clarina in this County, was robbed by six men, and Parker beat in a most inhuman manner. It is reported that the perpetrators were seen coming to this City, and had the appearance of porters—they left behind them a hat and coat, which Thomas Philips Vokes, Esq. a Magistrate, sent to Alderman Watson, where they can be seen. Amongst the articles stolen were a silver watch, a whitish coat, a black coat, three blue coats, several shirts and other wearing apparel, and two pounds in cash.

On Thursday, as two zealous attached brothers, (fifteen and fourteen years of age,) sons of John Mitchell, Esq. of Coolmeen, in the county of Roscommon, grandson of James F. Massy, Esq. of Stoneville, in this Co. were examining a loaded fowling-piece in one of the apartments of their father's house, it accidentally exploded while in the hands of the elder brother, and killed the younger lad upon the spot. The Rev. Montague Short, who was on a visit to the family, and was engaged writing in the room immediately adjoining, on hearing the report of a gun, at first conjectured that one of the lads had discharged it (as frequently they were in the habit of doing) from a window which commands a lawn in the rear of the house. A few seconds however, elapsed, and he heard a fall; when instantly springing into the room, he beheld with consternation the elder brother aghast and motionless, and the younger stretched upon the floor, the roof his skull literally blown to atoms, and his brains scattered in every direction. It was ascertained by the Coroners's Inquest which sat upon the body, and which immediately returned a verdict of accidental death; that the gun was held in an oblique direction, as the contents were lodged high in the wall, very near the ceiling of the room. Thus prematurely fell James Fitzgerald Massy Mitchell, a youth of truly amiable and accomplished manners, distinguished for every virtue that could endear a tender child, and form the character of a christian man. One consolation remains to his afflicted parents, and not less afflicted brother; a consolation flowing from an humble but steadfast reliance on the promises of God, that, although his mortal part is snatched from their society in this "vale of tears," yet his gentle spirit is removed to those blessed regions "where the wicked cease from troubling, and the weary are at rest."
