Sunday night an attack was made on an indus- trious farmer of the name of Coffee, who lives near Foxhall, (Co. Tipperary) by a considerable number of nightly marauders, with intent to force away his daughter, and compel her to unite herself to a man of the name of Collins—Her fa- ther obtained private information of the intended attack, and had some of his friends in the house, well armed, who permitted them to break in the door, when they fired on them, by which one man, named Skeahan, from near Doonas was killed, and several wounded, as blood was traced to a conside- rable distance—Skeahan was brother-in-law to Collins. This is the second attack which has taken place on the same man lately. Some time back, Collins carried off his daughter and kept her several days, but Coffee's friends prevailed on Collins, or rather dreading the close pursuit which Coffee and his friends held up, allowed her to re- turn, imagining by that means to effect a reconcilia- tion, but Coffee was not to be frightened into an alliance with such a character—the above was the consequence. Collins was on Monday morn- ing, in the neighbourhood of Castle Connell, in a state of madness, armed with a musquet.—The body of Skeahan lies at the guard house of Newport.

Saturday morning, the body of the young man named Hitternan, whom we stated in Wednes- day's Chronicle, to have been drowned, while bathing off the salmon-weir bank, was taken up near the spot where he unhappily perished.—The Mayor held an inquest on the body, and a verdict was returned accordingly.

A woman named Bourn, whilst in the act of stealing potatoes near Clonmel on Saturday, re- ceived a blow which deprived her of life.

Sixty-six persons in fever were admitted into the several assylums in Clonmel last week.
