On Sunday and Monday, forty-six male and six
female convicts from Kilkenny, Carlow and Mary-
borough, under a strong military escort, passed
through Clonmel, on their route to Cork, there to
embark for Botany Bay.

Yesterday, 12 convicts, on their way to Cork
from Castlebar, for transportation, arrived here
under an escort of the 20th Light Dragoons, and
this morning proceeded to their destination.

Some persons having lately injured the towers
and buoys which were erected by the Chamber of
Commerce, in the Shannon, to aid its navigation,
they have offered a reward of Ten Guineas for
such information as will enable them to prosecute.
It is a constant practice for persons passing up or
down in boats, to fire at those marks, but, we be-
lieve, without any intention of doing mischief, and
they should be aware that committing such an act
in future, will make them liable to the penalties
prescribed by law.

An inquest was held last week in the Co. jail,
before Thomas F. Wilkinson, and Christopher A.
Marrett, Esqrs. Justices of the Peace, on the body
of James Sheehy, Verdict, "died by the visitation
of God, and not by any injury or violence."—And
on Thursday last, another inquisition was taken
before the above Magistrates, on the body of John
Collins, who had been confined in said prison, Ver-
dict, "died a natural death."—Neither of the
above cases were connected with the present pre-
vailing malady.

The contradiction of the loss of the Cork
Steam Packet, the report of which excited so
much alarm in this City on Tuesday and Wednes-
day, appears in our fourth page—the propagator
cannot be visited with punishment too great for so
heinous an offence, and as he has been found to be
subject to military discipline, we doubt not but he
will be dealt with according to his merits, as there
appears a very strong section in the mutiny act
against raising false alarms.

Early on Sunday morning, Edward Deane,
Esq. Deputy Inspector General, accompanied by
Messrs. Hare and Deane, officers of Excise, and
a party of the 93d Highlanders, stationed at Ennis,
paid an unexpected visit to the neighbourhood of
Moyree, where they detected an extensive private
distillery which they destroyed together with a
considerable quantity of Pot-ale, Malt, &c. and
brought in, and lodged in Jail, two men whom
they found occupied in grinding malt for the illicit
concern.

Yesterday the Right Worshipful Mayor, fined
a Hackney-driver ten shillings, for refusing to pro-
ceed with a Gentleman who had hired his carriage
the previous day, which fine he handed to the
Treasurer of the House of Industry.

On Monday last the High Sheriff of the Co.
Tipperary received instructions from the Lord
Lieutenant, causing the bodies of the murderers of
the late Mr. Baker, who had been gibbeted near

Tuesday.
