The Hon. Mr. Hare, and Lord Fitzgibbon, were elected for the Co. Cork—the Hon. Mr. Hare, the proprietor of the Freeholder was elected, but rejected by the Sheriff, in consequence of his not giving three days notice of his intention of being a Candidate as required by the Act.

The Election commences to-morrow. In consequence of the resignation of Edward Leake, Esq. and Sir Rowland Blennerhassett, and the Right Hon. Lord Fitzgibbon, Knight of Kerry, were on the list of Candidates for the County Kerry.

Deputy, Esq. was elected for the County of Kerry. At Ennis, Sir Edward O'Brien, former Representative, and the Right Hon. Lord Fitzgibbon, (in place of Major General Leake) will be elected members in Parliament for the County Clare.

Understanding the different rumours and reports published to the contrary, the Election for the County of Tipperary is proceeding: A meeting of the inhabitants of Clonmel took place on Monday evening several Resolutions were entered into in consequence of their indignation at the arrangements which were made between the Candidates for the Elective Franchise, and calculated to deprive or neutralize their rights as Electors. A Committee was directed to propose the Hon. Mr. Leake, and arrangements are made to meet at Clonmel on Monday next.

It has been informed that a messenger of one of the County Tipperary Candidates, riding on Monday, was stopped on the road from Caher to Clonmel yesterday, and very seriously beaten—his horse and carriage were also cut off.
