During a long life he was highly respected and esteemed; he was an excellent father and friend; to his numerous tenantry he was a kind and considerate landlord, and his death is unfeignedly regretted. His remains are to be interred in the family vault at Caberconlish to-morrow. Alderman Gabbett served the office of Sheriff in 1775, and Mayor of this City in 1790; he was also High Sheriff of this County.
