There was a dreadful riot at the fair of Ballyscanlan, in this County, on Wednesday, between two parties. One man, named John Nash, a carpenter, from Kilpeacon, who went there for the avowed purpose of fighting, was killed on the spot, and several others wounded, amongst whom was a man of the name of John Morosy; having received a ball in the breast, he was brought to town, and is now under the care of Surgeon Franklin, who entertains hopes of his recovery. There were upwards of eighty stand of arms among the party.

The Mid-day Coach from Dublin to Cork broke down on Kiworth mountain on Thursday and we understand that the whole of the passengers and one of the guard have been more or less injured, but not severely. The Rev. Mr. M'Sheane, of Bantry was inside. We have not learned the names of the other passengers.
