AND I do hereby require all the Petty Constables, to make strict and respective districts and parishes, to prevent the selling of Spirits on Sunday, or within the houses, and to return the names of the persons who come within their knowledge to be punished as the Law directs.

AND the better to enforce the same, all such Church Wardens, High Constables, and others, as shall be assisting the Petty Constables, shall meet with every assistance that the Law will afford.
