He had for some time been labouring under that decline of constitution which was natural to his age, for his years could not have been under 86. He was a man of great probity and honor. In the private intercourse of life, the more beloved and esteemed, the more he was known. In a public, Magisterial, and political view, a steady and inflexible friend and supporter of peace and good order, upon the purest, and most independent constitutional principles. We do not know how his vast wealth of landed estates and money will go, as he has left no issue, but we believe *Chambre Brabazon Ponsouby*, of Belmont-Lodge, Queen's Co. Esq. and Mrs. Barton, relict of Thomas Barton, Esq. of Grove, are two of his nearest relatives. He married, early in life, Miss Lane, the daughter and heiress of the late William Lane, Esq. an eminent and opulent Attorney, who has lived to survive and lament him—At Donoughmore Glebe, the Rev.
