London Corn-Exchange, November 6.

The supply of English Wheat at market this morning being rather small, that of fine quality met ready sale at last Monday's prices, notwithstanding the arrival of 10,000 quarters from abroad in the course of this week. Barley, both English and Foreign, is from 3s. to 4s. per quarter cheaper, the supply of each having been large, and the demand inordinate to it, owing to the reluctance of Malsters to purchase at present prices in consequence of the dull state of the malt trade. Although the arrivals of Oats continue large, yet from the extensiveness of the demand, sales were brisk at an advance of full 1s. a quarter on Monday's prices.
