 A considerable quantity of fat Cattle have
 passed through this City within these ten days for
 Cork—yesterday nearly two hundred excellent
 bullocks belonging to Mr. Pilkington, arrived here
 and were driven off for Cork.
 John Durack, mate of the *Mary Ann*, lying
 at this port, was on Thursday morning despe-
 rately wounded in the groin, by stabs received
 from a pilot named Pigott, with whom some warm
 words took place—Pigott has absconded, and
 Durack is not out of danger.

On Tuesday, Sarah Ryan was murdered near
 Doone, in this County. The perpetrator has not
 yet been apprehended.

Wednesday night, about eleven o'clock, an
 idiot, named Dalton, was turned out of the main
 guard-house, (where he had been in the habit of
 sleeping) shortly after, as he was walking along
 the causeway, about a mile from the city, he was
 met by a man named John Kenny, driving a
 sheep—the fool, who was a stout fellow, tied
 Kenny's thumbs together with a cord, and tying
 the sheep to him, drove both into town—on being
 questioned about the sheep, he said he had bought
 it in the Co. Clare, but it was next morning dis-
 covered he had stolen it off Colonel O'Donnell's
 lands in that county—the thief is now in gaol.

The following receipt is considered as an almost

 could afford. This Assembly was rendered particularly
 attractive and pleasant, by the general attention and
 gentlemanly manners of the Steward, Captain Jaques, who,
 with Captain Mansergh, 82th Regiment, contributed very
 much to the conviviality of the evening, by singing several
 select songs—and one, in particular, with regard to the
 disbanding of the Army, which was sung by Capt. Mansergh,
 with excellent effect, and was received in the very best
 manner."
