A woman named Mary Conway, of this City, fell into the river at Castle-Connell yesterday, and would have perished but for the exertions of John Bowen and Thomas Burke, who at the risk of their lives preserved her from being drowned.— The usual means of restoration to life were skillfully resorted to by Mr. Dungan, Medical Attendant to the Castle-Connell Dispensary, and the poor woman is in a fair way of recovery.

A soldier of the 23d Fusileers, named Reily, was killed on Sunday, by a loaded musket accidentally going off in the barracks at Bruff. The unfortunate man was one of a party who had been conveying prisoners from Kilmallock, on their way to Limerick, and in consequence of a violent storm of hail and rain, were ordered to stop for some time at Bruff—he went up stairs, while another of the party below was drawing the ball from his musket, which went off, and passing thro' the ceiling, entered his thigh, and from thence to his bowels; instant medical assistance was procured, but he died shortly after, and a verdict of accidental death was returned by a jury, before James Bennett, Esq. coroner.

On the night of Tuesday se'nnight, eight fat others, the property of Edmond Power, Esq. were stolen off the demesne of Gurteen.

The dwelling-house of a farmer named Shehan, Patrick's-well, in this County, was burned to ground on Monday night—whether accidental or not, we have not learned.

At one o'clock, yesterday morning, 12 fellows entered the demesne of Joseph M. Harvey, Esq. Summerville, near this City, by means of a ladder, and after getting over the gate of the stable-yard, and viewing the offices therein, they returned by the same gate, went round the dwelling, and over the wall of the lawn adjoining the road, as directed by their track. They did not attempt to enter any door or window—it is thought their object was to reconnoitre the premises, rather than to enter (it being moonlight) and as they made no noise the family were not disturbed by their visit; but the gang who stood as sentinels opposite the entrance gate, threw stones at the windows of it, on seeing the man who resides there coming out, and broke several panes of glass.— It is said that they brought the ladder from a house near the Windmill, where it had been in use the preceding day; and they left it by the river side as they were returning to town, from whence they proceeded.
