 We have had but little English Wheat at market Monday, yet from the smallness of the demand, sales have at that day's price. In Foreign Wheat there is little or nothing doing, and prices are nominal.—Barley offered full 2s. per qr. below Monday's prices, but could be disposed of, the consumption at present being very trifling. Beans and Peas go off strictly, at a reduction of from 1s to 2s. per qr.—Oats support Monday's prices, but sales far from brisk.

Dublin Corn Exchange, February 27.  
 The accounts received by the last Packet of the decline in price and general dullness in the English markets, have a visible effect on ours. The usual export buyers hold unless tempted by very low prices. Our supply of oats is considerable by Canal, and only the distillers buying sparingly, has dropped prices considerably. Good ground oats, 10s. 6d. to 17s.; Feeding, 17s. to 18s. 6d. Heavy and lower, best samples, 43s. Barley in London for grinding, 27s. to 29s. Oatmeal and malt entirely neglected. Flour on the decline; best seconds, 25s. 6d.; and middling, 24s. to 25s. Seed Oats very much in demand and difficult to be had. Vetches, 7s. to 80s.; Red Clover, £7 to £7 10s.; White, £8 10s.

Irish Provisions in London Market—There is little variation in beef and pork since our last. The demand for is rather increasing, particularly for the good descriptions.
