markable through life for an amiable and obliging dispo-

himself, he never became an object of offence from others.  
To the fatherless and the widow he was the unostentatious  
friend; and to such as he considered deserving objects, he  
distributed his charity without distinction. In the duties of  
his office he minutely blended the essential qualities of firm-  
ness, moderation, and humanity. By his numerous friends  
he will be long sincerely regretted; and as he lived without
