This day the Lord Bishop of Limerick left the See House, for London.

We perceive, by the fifth report of the Commissioners on Irish Courts of Justice, that the Judges of the Court of King's Bench are anxious to abolish the receipt of fees, and in lieu thereof to provide an adequate annual compensation in the nature of salary. The receiving of fees, in their Lordships' opinion, is most humiliating to them, and disgraceful to the administration of justice.

Letters patent have passed the Great Seal, appointing Dr. Wm. Percival, Physician-General to his Majesty's army in Ireland, in room of Doctors Quin and Harvey, deceased.

The Lord Lieutenant has appointed Neptune Blood, Esq. to levy and collect fines in respect of unlawful distillation, and to execute all warrants for the collection of such fines, in the Counties of Roscommon, Longford, and Westmeath.

The 5th Light Dragoons, 67th and 87th Regt. quartered in India, have subscribed 3200 rupees for the widows of Soldiers killed at Waterloo.

Colonel Roberts late 51st whose death we announced in our last was the author of the very popular little poem of Johnny Newcome in the army.

An affray took place last week at K. Maloe, between the usually contending parties in that town: one man had his finger shot off, and another was run through the body by the military, who were obliged to be resorted to on the occasion
