Thursday night, three fellows, with fire-arms, broke into the house of a Widow woman of the name of Toohy, on the Ballyseeda road, Liberties of this City—they burst in the room where she lay, with a child, in the small-pox, and, after firing a shot into the bed, which wounded the child, they beat the unfortunate woman in the most desperate manner, with the end of a pistol, first taking the precaution to cover her head with the clothes; in this situation the poor woman caught hold of the pistol and wrestled for some time, declaring she would not let it go—and it was only upon their threatening to cut off her hand that induced her to do so. This affair is the more distressing as the entire family of the poor woman (eight children,) have only just recovered from a violent fever. There no hopes of the child's recovery.
