The following has been issued from the General
 Post Office:—

“The Statute of 55 George III. Cap. 153, so far as relates
 to the Postage and Conveyance of Letters, Newspapers,
 Printed Prices Current, and Printed Papers to and from the
 Cape of Good Hope, Ceylon, the Mauritius, and the East In-
 dia, is repealed; in consequence of which no more Packet
 Letters will be forwarded between Great Britain and those
 Parts. By an Act of this Session, all Letters brought into
 Great Britain by ships and vessels from the above Parts, are
 liable to a Sea Postage of Fourpence each, if not exceeding
 three ounces, and one shilling per ounce above that weight,
 in addition to the inland Rates. And all letters to the above
 places, which may be sent through the Post-Office, are liable
 to a sea postage of two pence each, under the weight of three
 ounces, and one shilling per ounce if above that weight,
 in addition to the inland rates. Newspapers, Printed prices
 current, and Printed papers, duly stamped, may be conveyed
 to the above places for one penny each packet, not exceeding
 one ounce, and one penny per ounce above that weight. The
 Postage of all such letters, packets, and printed papers, must
 be paid at the time they are put into the Post-Office. The
 Act allows letters and Newspapers to be sent to the East
 Indies otherwise than through the Post-Office.”
