can be given to them, it is only necessary to refer you to that document, and to aid, that no proposal can be accepted which is not framed in conformity with the offer of his Misjesty's Government. With reference to your particular inquiries respecting the

mode in which the views of the Bottler in ly best be attained; I have to acquaint you, that It is not in Earl Bethurst's power to communicate to you that species of information, which can most properly be afforded by the practical agriculturalist, or obtained upon the spot.

The Settlers will be located in the interior of the Colony. not far from the coast; and in afforting to them the lands which Government have agreed to grant to them, their interests and their wishes will be essuited, and attended to, as far as may be consistent with the public interests of the Colony.

The Settlers will be enabled to purchase a limited quantity of agricultural implements in the colony, at prime cost; although they are not deburred from taking with them a moderate supply of these articles, as well as necessaries; and they will find no difficulty in purchasing seed corn in the

ception.

The person under whose direction a party of settlers, prereed, is at liberty to secure their services by any logal agreement into which they may think proper to enter.

.The new settlement will, of course, be governed according The amount of the laws in force in the colony,

In conclusion, I beg to observe, that it must be left to the persons taking out Settlers, to form their own opinion as to the amount of the pecuniary means with which they should be provided, in order to support the persons placed under their directions, and ensure the success of their undertuking.
