Post News.—Arrived, *True Briton*, Read, Quebec.

The *General Graham*, Christian, 450 tons burthen, which
put into Kilrush last Saturday, was after performing an
India voyage, and the owners dispatched her about six weeks
since from London, for Quebec to bring home a cargo of
timber: she was within two days' sail of the banks of New-
foundland when she sprung a leak, and the crew then deter-
mined upon putting back, and making for the first port in
Ireland. She made so much water on the passage that it
was with the greatest difficulty she could be kept afloat by
continual pumping; and were it not for the friendly aid of
another vessel, which conveyed her to the mouth of the Shan-
non, the crew would have deserted her. She is now under-
going repairs, and is drawn up on the shore at the foot of
Cappagh, and has a very large hole in her bottom.
