Last night the house of Denis Shehan, farmer, near Ballinanty, in the North Liberties of this City, was attacked by a number of men who broke his windows and fired several shots therein; however, by the spirited resistance of Shehan, and his two sons they were beaten off, and though the neighbourhood was alarmed and a pursuit made, they effected an escape.

Wednesday night a woman named Nealon, residing at Thomand-Gate, near this City, went to bed in good health, and was found dead on Thursday morning.

Five Mouse-Deer Heads and Horns, quite in a perfect state, were found last week by some men digging in a bog belonging to Mr. Arthur Copley, Inn-holder at Charleville: they are stated to be the largest of the kind ever seen in that country; one head measured 2½ feet long, and the horns extended thirteen feet; the others were much in the same proportion. A blade-bone was also dug up which surpasses in size any ever found in Ireland. Large sums were offered for them to Copley, but they were presented by him to Robert Maxwell, Esq. of Charleville, and Robert O'Callaghan Newenham, Esq. of this City.

A Pumpkin, weighing eighty-seven pounds, grown at Mr. Wilson's Nursery, on the Roxborough road, is now exhibited in his shop, George's-street—its circumference is six feet; the diameter, two feet.

Some activity has been given to the Wool trade, by a Government contract for the supply of Grey Cloth, which will consume one Thousand packs of Wool, and it has advanced in consequence in England, to 35s per pack.

It is imagined that the price of Pork will open at 40s. per cwt. but will not long hold such rate, as it is expected to be considerably under that price during the season. The contract has been taken so low, that it warrants the assertion, that the feeders will not have any profit this season, as it is well known the stores cost much over the price which the contract rate would afford.—Tallow, it is also said, will be 4s. per stone under last year's prices.

**Irish Provisions.**—The extensive Government contract was yesterday taken by one house, at much lower rates than what had been generally anticipated, £7 12s. 6d. for India and Navy Beef and Pork, and for the barrels £5 2s. 6d.

In consequence of the low prices of the contract, and the whole being taken at one price, the quotations of Beef and Pork may be considered nominal; the former rates could not be realised, and the probable effect is, that it will occasion a considerable decline in the prices of provisions.
