On Saturday week, a detachment of the 13th
Regiment of Foot marched into Edinburgh Castle,

does not, however, appear, that any augmentation
to the present number of Officers on full pay will
take place.

Chatham; 2d, at Portsmouth; 3d, at Plymouth;
4th, at Hull; 5th, at Chester; 6th and 7th, at
Inverness and Edinburgh; and three in India.
The total amount of this force, when completed
with Officers and men, will be upwards of seven
thousand two hundred.
