The *Globe* of Saturday states—"It is rumoured that the Marquis Buckingham will succeed Earl Talbot, as Lord Lieutenant of Ireland—the Noble Earl, in consequence of his present severe domestic affliction, having expressed an anxious wish to resign the cares of Government."

The ship East Indian, intended to take out Mr. William Parker and his settlers to the Cape of Good Hope, has arrived at the Cove of Cork.

Two outrages of a daring description were committed in the town of Charleville and its vicinity, between the early hours of six and seven o'clock, on Monday, by armed men, with their faces blackened, entering two houses, and stealing thereout five musquets, one case of pistols, and a bayonet. The Gentlemen of that place have offered a handsome reward in this day's Chronicle, for the apprehension of the perpetrators.

Most unaccountable circumstance—A young man of the name of Patrick Collins, a Corporal on the Staff of the Co. Limerick Militia; and a young woman named Mary Colopy, died in a house in Bohirbuoy, on Monday last, from the effects of Poison. There are various reports in circulation; but, though an Inquest has been holding since yesterday, and by adjournment, this day, nothing has yet occurred to developé this very mysterious affair. There are three persons, relatives of the deceased in jail, on suspicion of administering the Poison. The Bodies were opened, and the Surgeons have declared their opinions, that it was not by mineral poison the deaths were caused, but must have been effected by vegetable matter. The deceased persons were found in bed together, in a state of suffocation, early in the morning of Monday; they lingered till near three o'clock, without being able to utter a word in explanation. When the inquest shall close we purpose detailing the depositions.

Last night, Catherine M'Guire, one of the Widows of St. George's Alms House, in Michael-street, was found dead on the floor, having been suffocated, by introducing coals into her bed-room in a metal pot, there being no chimney therein. This is the second death which occurred in that Asylum within the last fortnight, from the same cause.
