An agreement was subsequently entered into between the parties, upon a difference in Politics, and his demands were to be satisfied upon surrendering and giving up certain documents—this agreement was not ratified, as the Defendants asserted the Plaintiff had failed to perform his contract. A consent was put in by the Defendants to leave the matter in dispute to the arbitration of Messrs. Pennefather and Jackson, two of Plaintiff's Counsel, who have been occupied for the last two days in hearing evidence, which closed last night, but the award is not yet pronounced.

COUNTY CRIMINAL COURT.

Derby Conroy was capitally indicted for burglariously entering the dwelling-house of John Leo, at Tubberneigh, and taking thereout two guns and a pistol, breaking locks, and putting the family in terror of their lives; and also with intent to carry away the daughter of said John Leo, on the 19th of October last—Guilty.

Morty Culhane, indicted capitally, for taking a musket from Henry Sandys, a Corporal in the 12th Regiment, on the 21 of March, instant. It appeared that the soldier was on his way to Buttevant from Kiltrush, accompanied by another soldier, who met with Culhane near Kilecoleman, and that his brother-soldier spoke to Culhane, the Irish language, injurious to Sandys, and there appeared a combination between them; about a mile from Kilecoleman the corporal was overtaken by Culhane; the soldier presented at him, but the gun misted fire twice, upon which Culhane closed on him and took away his gun, knocked him down, and gave it to one Kelly, a by-stander, who gave it to the soldier. His Lordship observed that there was not evidence to convict the prisoner capitally; but the soldier was the first aggressor, for in presenting, he might have shot prisoner.—Acquitted. His Lordship then addressed the prisoner as follows:—"Culhane, you have now escaped punishment in this case, and be very careful how you come into that dock again—take care to how you follow or tamper with soldiers on his Majesty's highway, for if you were found guilty of taking the arms forcibly from the soldier, I should feel it my duty to pronounce sentence of death upon you, and most indisputably you should have been hanged."

Cornelius Ryan, for firing at an unknown person, with intent to kill. T. R. Ryan, Esq deposed, that on the 5th of September last, he repaired in his Magisterial capacity, to the fair place of Hospital, where there were two parties armed, firing shots, &c. that he could not identify any particular person, but that he saw the prisoner fire a shot from a gun at the gap of the fair, at the opposite party, and while prisoner was in the act of re-loading his piece, he (Mr Ryan) secured the prisoner, and committed him to jail. Guilty of a Riot.

John Morris, sen. and John Morris jun. (father and son) for the murder of Michael Murphy, in the town of Pallas on the 21st of January last, on their way from a fair. Guilty of Manslaughter.

Richard Ford, Michael Ford, and John Fitzgibbon, were indicted for burglary and robbery, in the house of John Hogan, at Roun, on Friday last. Guilty.
