 This Gentleman fifty years back was Major in the 33rd
 Regiment; he served the early part of his life in the service
 of his King and Country, where his excellent judgment and
 amiable manners universally endeared him—in Clonmel,
 Mrs. Banks, wife of Mr. Samuel Banks, late of this City,
 Merchant, and daughter of the late Mr. John Taylor, of
 Clonmel—in Kinsale, Mrs. Mildenhall, daughter of the
 late John Jeffords, Esq. of Seart—in Broom-hill, near
 Kilsash, Mrs. Parkinson, wife of Robert Parkinson, Esq.—
 In Tuam, the relict of David Jennings, Esq.—At Clonakilty,
 Henry Gould, Esq.—In Killesnohra, John Faris, Esq.—In
 Upper Gardiner-street, Dublin, Malachy Callaghan, Esq. of
 the Firm of Thomas Callaghan and Sons—in Mallow-lane,
 Cork, the wife of J. Fitzgibbon, Esq.—in Clonmel, the wife
