Doctor Mant, the lately appointed Lord Bishop of Killaloe, is to be consecrated at the Cathedral, Cashel, on Sunday next. The Lord Bishop of Limerick will assist in the ceremony.

The appointment of Doctor, the Hon. Percy Jocelyn to the Bishopric of Clogher, is officially announced in the Dublin Gazette.

The canonical visitation of this Diocese will be held by the Archbishop in the Cathedral of this City on Tuesday the 16th inst.

The Provost of Dublin College presented an Address from the University to the King, at his levee, on Thursday.

The general mourning, occasioned by the death of the late King, terminated on Sunday.

The Lord Chancellor has been pleased to appoint Joseph Bourke, Esq. of Greenhill, to be a Magistrate for the Counties of Galway and Roscommon.

Sir Edward O'Brien, Bart., sailed in the Waterloo Steam Packet, from Dublin for Liverpool, on Sunday last.

Lord Massy, Lady Massy, and family, have arrived in London, from Paris.

Sir C. Cochrane is to succeed Lord Exmouth in command at Plymouth.

Lord Frederick Lenox (third son of the late Duke of Richmond,) is gone to Nova Scotia, with Sir James Kemps, who is appointed Commander-in-Chief.

General Sir Lowry Cole has arrived in London.

Lieut.-General Sir Henry Tucker Montresor has been appointed second in command of the Forces in this Kingdom, and is to be stationed in Dublin. A few years ago this gallant Officer commanded our Garrison, and we may with truth affirm, that never did a Commander make himself more popular, for he possessed the rare but happy talent of rendering strict discipline palatable by lenity of manners, and a temper

Monday last, the Police appointed under the Peace Preservation Act, for the County Limerick, passed through this City from Dublin for Rushkeale, which is to be head-quarters—they consist of four Chief Peace Officers, 50 mounted, and 150 infantry, clothed in dark green and equipped in a military manner—they are under the control of Richard Geoghegan, Esq., of Enniscorthy, Barrister at Law, who is appointed Chief Magistrate of the County—all the men were inspected at the Head Police Office, Dublin, on yesterday evening by Major Sirr.

A large number of Revenue Horse Police have arrived in the County Galway. Thirty of them, under the command of Lieut. Franklin, late 33rd Regiment, are stationed in the vicinity of Gort.

A wretched looking creature named Patrick Lynch, was taken up last week by Major Warburton's Police, in Kilrush, and transmitted to this City. He was examined before Alderman Watson, on Thursday, and made a voluntary confession of all the circumstances attending the outrage committed some time since on the Salmonweir Bank, at which he was present, though not a participant in the guilt, but charges his own brother with being a principal in the affair.

On Sunday last, a small boat, having two young men and two women on board, upset, near Plassey, when one of the lads, named Patrick Carrig, was unfortunately drowned—the other young man and one of the women got to the land with great difficulty, while the second woman clung to the boat until she was taken up by another boat.

A large quantity of hay was burned on Sunday night, near Castle-Council. The cause, whether accidentally or otherwise, has not been ascertained.

A Society for the suppression of Mendicity is about to be formed in Ennis. Sir Ed. O'Brien and the Right Hon. Vesey Fitz-Gerald have each subscribed 100 guineas to this desirable object.

By a clause in one of the Charters of the City of Cork, it is provided that no person shall presume to practice Medicine or Surgery in said City, altho' he may have studied and taken degrees in the most eminent Colleges, without first taking out a license from the Mayor, under a Penalty of 40s for each and every month he may so practice without such License.
