The usual ceremony of executing five of the
conspirators for High Treason, was carried into
effect at the Old Bailey, on Monday last. We
give the particulars under its proper head—the
wretched men, with the exception of one, were
launched into eternity in a most lamentable state
of mind; the account is deeply affecting.
This day, David Dugga, convicted at the
Sessions of Rathkeale, was taken from the County
Jail, to Newcastle, to be flogged, pursuant to his
sentence:—At Adare, the Sub-Sheriff was met by
a party of Mr. Going's Police, who took charge
of the prisoner, and proceeded from thence to have
the sentence carried into effect.
A noted fellow of the name of Kennelly charged
with various offences, and who has set the Law
at defiance heretofore, was taken up beyond
Rathkeale, yesterday morning, by Mr. Going's
Police.
Yesterday morning, a clerk, of the name of
Sheehan, fell from the upper loft or trap door of a
Merchant's store, in Henry-street, and had his
neck and spinal bone broken. He was immediately
removed to the County Hospital where he died at
eleven o'clock last night. He was a young man of
very good character, and has left a wife and child.
On Thursday night, the Parish Watchman,
stationed at the head of Bridge-street, was attacked
by three fellows with stones, and so desperately
wounded, that his life is in imminent danger.
