Government has issued the following to Colonels of Irish Militia:— It is not considered expedient that the Militia of Ireland should be called out, trained, and exercised, for the period prescribed, for the current year.

Doctor M. Barry is elected President of the Cork Philosophical and Literary Society.

Yesterday, twenty men, convicted of various offences at the Sessions of Rathkeale, were lodged in the County Jail, under an escort of Mr Going's Police. Some of them were tried, and sentenced to be imprisoned and find bail, for assaulting Edward Hunt, Esq. a Magistrate, who was quelling a riot at the fair of A-keaton.

On Monday last, two men having been engaged in making hay, on the lands of Killeen, near Newport, one of them, named Murphy, received a blow of a pitchfork from his comrade in the head, which killed him on the spot. The perpetrator has absconded. They had no previous dispute, and the cause of his death is considered accidental.

The sloop *Elizabeth*, of Blennerville, 80 tons burthen, the property of Christopher Galway, Esq. of Killarney, was wrecked off Dursiese, on Saturday last.

At the request of the Mayor and Magistrates of this City, a meeting of the Manufacturers of Stuffs, and those concerned in the vending of them, together with some intelligent journeymen weavers, took place at the Council Chamber, on Thursday, at which it must be gratifying to learn, arrangements were agreed upon, likely to keep the working classes of that trade in full employ, as the shop-keepers have resolved not to introduce in future any stuffs or other woollen articles for sale into the City from foreign markets, which can be as well wrought therein.

Yesterday, the remains of an human body were discovered on some waste ground in Newtown. The Right Worshipful Mayor having held an Inquest, the Jury returned the following verdict:— "We find that the skeleton of a male person, unknown, now viewed by us, appears to have been, at some remote period, used for anatomical purposes, and latterly exposed in a private manner on the waste ground in the Parish of St. Michael." The Mayor provided a coffin for the remains, and caused them to be interred in St. Patrick's burial ground.
