VERY LATE FROM LISBON.

Cork Southern Reporter Office,
4 o'Clock, Tuesday.

"The *Lively Ann*, arrived in this river last night in seven days from Oporto, by which we have Papers from thence to the 8th inst. and from Lisbon to the 29th ult. The Juntas of Oporto and Lisbon had formed a Coalition for carrying on the public affairs, till the Cortes assembled, which was to be convoked with all possible dispatch, when the Juntas would be dissolved."

On Sunday night, Lieut. Thomas Long, half-pay 58th Regiment, was murdered in the street of Ballina, Co. Mayo. The perpetrators are four labourers and two women.

Sunday morning last, the body of a man named James Ryan, was found lying on the beach at the ferry slip, Newtown. The Right Worshipful the Mayor having held an Inquest, the Jury, on due investigation, returned a verdict, "Accidentally drowned."

Yesterday, Patrick Boyle, was found dead in the Stables of the late Hotel, in Bridge Street; a Coroner's Jury returned "died by the visitation of God."

An apprentice to Mr James Fitzgerald, Marble Manufacturer, named Daniel Crean, (who, with a number of his brother apprentices, formed a determination to dictate rules for the government of their master, and who quitted his service because he had the hardihood not to bend to such dictation.) was on Monday last convicted in Cork, under 31 Geo. 3, chap. 23, of elopement, and committed to gaol for four months, by order of Sir David Perrier.

ADDRESS FROM THE CLERGY
OF THE
DIOCESE OF ARDFERT AND AGHADOE
TO THE
LORD BISHOP OF CLOYNE.

MY LORD,
Your Lordship's recent translation having reminded the State of this united Diocese, upon your appointment to the superintendance, we, the Clergy of Ardfert and Aghadoe, deeply impressed with a sense of the advantages to Religion, to the Church Establishment, and to ourselves, of that measure has been so productive, beg leave to express our warmest remembrance, by an expression of our respectful gratitude.

In every district of this extensive and remote Diocese many Churches have been erected with an anxious solicitude for the convenience of the Inhabitants as well as the advancement of Religion. Glebes have been purchased and built thereon, whereby our personal comforts have been promoted, and our local influence widely extended; while great and paramount objects of our Ministry have been facilitated, and the security and well being of the Establishment promoted by the formation of a Society for the distribution of the Holy Scriptures, accompanied by Prayer Books and Religious Tracts. And though we rejoice in the prospect of an extension of those blessings to others, from your Lordship's translation, yet cannot this consciousness reconcile us to a separation from you, as long, so much, and so deservedly respected.

We venture not, therefore, to indulge in any expression of our feelings upon your Lordship's removal, after an absence of fifteen years, but shall content ourselves with an assurance (simple as sincere) of gratitude for that superior temper and amenable disposition, (so consonant with Episcopal character,) by which our applications had been all times received, and our wants and accommodations unfrequently anticipated.
