At four o'clock on Thursday more og, a more of armed fellows, on horseback, were seen passers the cross of Ballyneety, and having taked whether the Police were there, and being answered in the negative, they continued their route, and broke. into a forge, from whence they took a sledge, and having supplied themselves with lighted coals, they proceeded to attack the house of Perick Ward, a respectable farmer, which, after aring into, they largiariously entered. Garrett Rodney Fitz-Gerald, Esq. a Magistrate of this County, residing near Ward's, hearing the boots, arose from his bed, and having got the assistance of some of his neighbours, they hastened to where the noise was, and approached Ward's house, where the bandati was assembled; they being alarmed, attempted an attack on Mr. Fitz-Gerald's party, which was, spiritedly resisted, and the fellows beat off. One of the banditti was shot Bead, and two others morsaily wounded; three were taken prisoners, but they got off. They were armed with musquets, pistols, and blunderbusses, and left behind them three stand of fire-arms. All the gang had their faces blackened, and one of them had a heated tongs and iron bat in his fiand, which were, with

difficulty, wrested from him by Mr. Fitz-Gerald. The Right Worshipful the Mayor, who was presiding in the Court of Conscience when he received information of the above ecurrence. immediately adjourned, and, with that promptitude which has distinguished him as a Magistrate, proceeded, with a detachment of the Scots Greys, to the scene of action, for the purpose of holding an Inquest. The log was so dense that the party found their way, with difficulty, to the residence of the deceased; but, after the most minute enquiry and examination on oath of several persons to the neighbourhood, no vestige of the body could be traced. It is, however, confidently supposed, that the miscreams committed it to the earth as soon na possible, in some remote Church-yard. The Mayor and party reached town about seven o'clock on Thursday evening.

The man who was killed is named Patrick

Connell, of Cahirnarry.

It is said that the party went for the purpose of taking off Ward's sieter in-law, against her cousent; and the young troman, on hearing their approach, decamped from the house in her chemise, and sought protection of a friend, three miles detant.

Too much praise cannot be given to Mr. Fitz-Gerald and his party. as, if their example was generally followed, the midnight ruffians' andacuy would be checked, and the industrious man reside in safety under his humble roof.

A detatchment of the Police is in future to be stationed at Ballyneety Cross.
