

French, Esq., has offered himself a Candidate for the County of Wick, in room of his deceased.—A contest is apprehended. Under Montgomery, Esq., is elected an Alderman of Dublin, vice West, deceased; and Pentland, Esq., Alderman of Drogheda, deceased.

In answer to a Requisition from several of the inhabitants of Cartow and its vicinity, a writ has been called by the Sovereign for the next, to take into consideration the petition of addressing his Majesty, and testifying his loyalty to his sacred person, and to his Majesty's Government.

It is known that a Vote of Thanks has been passed and is in progress of signature by the members of the County of Limerick, to G. R. D. Esq., for his spirited conduct in the defence of Ward's house, the result of which has been of immense service to the future of the County. Mr. Fitzgerald was aided by his nephew, Edmond Fitzgerald, Esq. and received equal praise.

It is much lamented Paul Dawson, Esq., a General of Customs, retired from his office on the evening of Friday last, apparently in good health, and next day, after a short illness, he terminated his existence by the bursting of a blood vessel in the head.

On Monday morning, at an early hour, a party of Revenue Police, under the command of Sergeant Breen, proceeded to the lands of the late, County Clare, where they detected an illicit Distillery at full work which they destroyed by carrying away the vessels and spilling eight barrels of potale, containing upwards of four hundred gallons.

On Sunday night, about nine o'clock, a party of about fifty men, well armed, attacked the house of John Casey, of Tomdeely, within a distance of a mile of the town of Askeaton, in the arms, into which they fired several shots and after breaking the doors, beat Casey's house in an desperate manner with the butts of muskets; they did not however succeed in getting arms at the house, but on retiring they took a gun from a room adjoining. Several musket balls were found in the house next morning.

On Sunday night, an out office belonging to Mr. Habbett, Esq. on the Ballinacurra Road, was broken open and a pair of cart wheels and some articles stolen thereout.

On Sunday last, an Inquest was taken by the Coroner, in the presence of the Mayor, on view of the body of Joseph Gubbins, hatter, who was found dead in his house, near Martyke, the preceding day.

Verdict—"We find that the deceased voluntarily put himself to death by hanging."—The Coroner ordered the body to be interred in a vaulted ground.

A child of about five years old, was burned to death on Monday, in Mary-Street, its clothes having caught fire.

On Monday night last, a West Indian man, name unknown, laden chiefly with Cotton, was driven from Ross Bay, to the Northward of Loop Head. The Captain was lost at Sea—the remainder of the crew were saved.
