on occasions, and his unbounded generosity on others,  
is now beginning to be known; and if it was necessary to find a  
per cent to fill the chasm made by the death of this  
extraordinary man, it would be a matter of no small  
difficulty. A few years ago he was engaged in a very serious  
illness; and it being demanded of him to name time, place,  
and friend, he ~~secretly~~ wrote in answer, "St. James's  
b-yard, Piccadilly—twelve o'clock at night—and the
