on occasions, and his unbounded generosity on others,
were not soon forgotten; and if it was necessary to find a
personage to fill the chasm made by the death of
this extraordinary man, it would be a matter of no small
difficulty. A few years ago he was engaged in a very serious
affair; and it being demanded of him to name time, place,
and friend, he calmly wrote in answer, "St. James's
Park, Piccadilly—twelve o'clock at night—and the
