Limerick City Election—Petition of John Standish and
others, also of Sir William Stamer, Bart and others,
touching the Right of Election, to lie on the Table.

Yesterday, about one o'clock, the front of two
houses in Love-lane, leading to the Little Island
from Dominick-street, fell down, by which two
boys, playing outside, were killed, and another
severely wounded not expected to recover.—
The houses were tenanted by several poor persons
who escaped unhurt, and the accident occurred by
the mismanagement of a mason who was employed
to alter some part of the gable-end.—The names
of those killed are Michael Liston, aged ten years,
and John Sheahan, aged six years.

The Sessions Grand Jury are to meet at twelve
o'clock on Tuesday next for the special purpose of
viewing such houses and walls as are ruinous, and
presenting to the notice of those whose duty it
will be to prostrate them, and prevent a recurrence
of the melancholy accident above detailed.

On Thursday last, two boys, playing in the
street of Tipperary, (the elder,) son of the Widow
Dwyer, about fourteen years; (the younger,) only
son of Mr. Patrick Crawly, a remarkably fine
lad of about twelve; after some altercation, the
younger boy snatched a turnip which the other was
in the act of peeling, when shocking to relate, he,
in a moment of passionate revenge, plunged a
shoemaker's cutting knife into the heart of his little
innocent play-fellow. He had only strength suffi-
cient enough to run to his father's house, a distance
of about twenty yards, when he called out to his
wretched parent, who opened the door to admit
him, unconscious of his situation, "Oh Mother he
killed me," and instantly expired. Under any
circumstances, murder carries with it the most
appalling idea the human mind is capable of con-
ceiving; but in the present melancholy instance,
the heart shudders and shrinks within itself at the
weakness and depravity of human nature. The
parents of both these unfortunate boys are reduced
to a most indescribable state of anguish. Young
Dwyer has been lodged in Tipperary Jail. This
unfortunate case should prove a warning to all
parents to have a watchful care of the youthful
passions of their offspring.
