The Board of First Fruits have granted £50 to build a Church, without any cost to the Parish, in St. Paul's, Dublin.

The Parishioners of Tullamore have presented a piece of plate to their late Curate, the Rev. William Farnes, as a mark of their respect and esteem. Mr. Farnes is appointed to the living of Clonfadforan.

Yesterday, the Church Missionary Society held its annual meeting; there were 2000 persons of distinction present. The funds of the Society for the year were voted at £31,000, and its expenditure £25,000.

The Excise Collector of Galway will attend the following places, in his District, to receive Assessed Taxes:—Galway, 21st May; Tuam, 1st June; Headfort, 4th; Tuam, 5th and 6th; Oughterard, 13th; and Clifton, 14th June.

On Saturday evening, about nine o'clock, John Hogan, the inside turnkey of Fenis jail, contrived to elude the vigilance of the outside turnkey, and pass out two of the prisoners under the pretence of transportation, with whom he endeavoured to leave the country. They had not, however, been out more than twenty minutes before a pursuit had commenced, by the party of police under Mr. Weldon, Chief Constable, who succeeded in apprehending Hogan and one of the convicts, named Clifford, within a mile of the town; Hogan on the road, and Clifford in the house of Carmody, who keeps the turnpike between Fenis and Clare. The other, named Feehly, separated from his companions, and endeavoured to pass to the County Kerry, but was apprehended on Sunday by the Police stationed in Kildysart, who were informed of the circumstance.
