

man; the necessity of pursuing such a conduct as should place him above the censure: the duty of residence, in the case of non-cures was particularly, and Primate Newcome's opinion upon the subject cited; the manner of performing Service, and the duty of adhering strictly to the consequences of deviating from the irregularity of substituting Hymns for Psalms, a practice which could not now be defended on the grounds of gratifying the congregation, as a collection of fifty Psalms, a great variety, set in parts, had been published at a very cheap rate. The Preacher's duty was adverted to, and rules given for attaining excellence in the composition of sermons; the authority of Bishop Hume referred to for the advantages resulting, under particular management, from sermons on moral topics, and particular notice taken of the dangerous consequences which had been known to arise from preaching on controversial subjects. His Lordship next dwelt on the importance of Catechising, and alluded to the excellent plan for Catechetical Instructions proposed by the Association for Promoting Religion, and then dwelt with much minuteness on the advantages resulting from Sunday Schools, and on the manner of conducting them where the children were of different religious persuasions, urging, in the strongest terms, the necessity of avoiding every thing which could reasonably be complained of as not of the Established Religion, and pointing out the manner in which discipline should be maintained without those harsh methods which tended to harden rather than to produce willing obedience. The charge concluded, with a very strong statement of the importance of constant intercourse with the Parishioners, of particular attention in visiting the sick, and a solemn prayer for the Divine Blessing on all the Ministers of God's word, and particularly those of this Diocese.

His Grace the Archbishop of Cashel will hold his annual Visitation at the Cathedral of Cashel, on Thursday, the 21st of June.

The Rev. Augustus Cecil Minchin, M. A. of Trinity College, Dublin, was Priested at an examination held on Sunday by the Bishop of Exeter, at Cambridge.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, is appointed to preach the Coronation Sermon.

The Commissioners of Customs have directed that the American Smuggler Maria, captured by H. M. S. Sappho, and lying at the Custom-house dock in this harbour, should be forthwith cut up, according to act of Parliament.

The Wickham, Revenue Cutter, Captain Bateson, captured on Wednesday off Belfast harbour, the Salley and Rosey, of Oxford, from Philadelphia, with 382 bales of tobacco, valued at £11,000.

On Wednesday, Edward V. Fitz-Gerald, Esq. apprehended a woman who was negotiating base 2s. 6d. 10d. and 5d. tokens, in the village of Pallis Kenry. She is lodged in gaol.

**Fraud in Sovereigns.**—Government has lately detected a most extraordinary fraud, which threatens great loss to the currency. Sovereigns to a great extent have been counterfeited, by casing Platina with Gold, the specific gravity of the two metals being nearly equal. In melting some Sovereigns, the Platina was detected in the bottom of the crucible.
