Monday night the house of Doctor Hart of  
 Portarlinton, was robbed of several valuable  
 articles; a hue and cry having been raised, the  
 perpetrators were apprehended in the town of  
 Naas by Mr. Harrison, coroner, and lodged in  
 jail; some of their booty is also recovered.

At his father's house, in Mourne, on Friday,  
 the 25th of May last, as John Loftus Hopkins,  
 a fine boy, four and a-half years old, son of  
 Captain John Hopkins, of the Revenue Service,
