Her widow bewept completed four months: during that period she shone forth as a bright example, not only of the attributes of exalted rank, but likewise of all the virtues that confer honour upon private life. Religious and domestic in her habits, elegant and refined in her manners, charitable to the poor, affable to all, she was highly and universally esteemed as a model of a wife, a neighbour, and a christians.
