THE DYSENTERY.
We have heard a most respectable Physician
assert, that there is no necessity whatever for
any alarm on this subject—that the disease is
not infectious, and is by no means to the extent
stated in the papers. Yet, however, the following
paragraphs have been sent for insertion this day,
from a quarter which we are bound to credit,
and they are in opposition in point of extent, to
the above assertion. There certainly is a mate-
rial difference between epidemic and infectious
diseases—of the latter, we are inclined to be-
lieve that the present does not partake.
We regret to state, that Dysentery still rages
here to an alarming extent, and it is a singular
fact, that for some days past, it has been more
fatal in the Parish of St. John's, than in the
other quarters of the City—up to the 5th instant,
eleven persons have died of this disease in
Palmerstown alone.
There are this day in the Dysenteric Wards
of the Fever Hospital twenty-four patients;
thirty-eight have been admitted since the 20th
of last month, of whom two only have died, and
twelve have been discharged cured:—there are
also in the Hospital thirty-three in fever, and
fifteen in other complaints, making in all seven-
ty-two. The additional expence to the Hospi-
tal has been very considerable, since the admis-
sion of patients afflicted with dysentery; the
increased consumption of wine, broth and milk,
is very great, and with two extra nurses, form
heavy items of expence. The Committee of the
Hospital, however, look with confidence to the
public, for the support of an Institution so essen-
tial to the preservation of the health of all ranks
in this City and County. From the nature of the
dysentery, the beds must be often changed,
straw is therefore much wanted, it is at present
scarce and dear, and benefactions in this way,
will be thankfully received. Another way pre-
sents itself, by which the humane can render
very great service to the sick poor on this me-
lancholy occasion, by giving them flannel waist-
coats on their recovery from this terrible disease,
either on leaving the Hospital, or on their con-
valescence in their miserable apartments; not
even after the worst fever is warm clothing more
wanting than it is to the debilitated invalid after
this disorder.
It is gratifying to learn, that though the
House of Industry at present contains 320
inmates, not a single case of Dysentery presents
itself. This Asylum, in point of cleanliness and
regularity, is not inferior to any other Institu-
tion, and the health of the many aged persons
under its roof, add additional credit to the
celebrity of the Physicians in attendance.
There is a report of two men having been
shot, in the neighbourhood of Newcastle on
Wednesday, in consequence of a dispute be-
tween two parties contending for the right of
repairing a road, but we have not been able
to learn the particulars.
