A met barbarous and inhuman murder was commied on a min named Foley, on the night of Thusday last, on the lands of Movidy, near Newcole, in this County, and the body afterwards rown into the river. James Condon, Esq. o Kilscannel, having got private information f the occurrence, immediately communicated with Major Wilcocks, through Lieut. Colone Dick, of the 42d Highlanders, who despataed Mr. Kiely, Chief Officer, with the Police, and succeeded in arresting the persons chargeogith the murder. The Rev. Mc.
