"Wednesday night, a party of the County Cork Police, detected a quantity of Bacon and Beef, with several articles of House Linen, Bedding, and Wearing Apparel, in one Murphy's house, near Tullillease; Murphy and the stolen Articles were safely conveyed to Buttevant Barrack, by the Police.

"A man of Messrs. Walker and Co. conveying Porter from Limerick to Newcastle, was killed on the road by the upsetting of the Dray.

"The Rev. Mr. Hogan, P. P. of Newcastle, from his Pastoral admonitions and exemplary zeal, has succeeded in getting arms from his deluded Parishioners, four stand of which were this day handed over by him to Godfrey Massy, Esq."

The three unfortunate men, Madigan, Lynch, and Lewis, convicted of burglary in the house of John Moore, Steward of Mr. Raymond's, of Hollywood, were hanged at Cappagh, on Wednesday. At the place of execution a vast concourse of spectators assembled, and every opportunity was afforded by Sheriff Cuthbert to let them hear the words uttered by the Convicts at their last moments, trusting that the examples before them would have due influence. Madigan fully acknowledged his guilt—and upon being questioned whether he had any participation in the murder of Mr. Going, he seemed greatly agitated and requested that the matter would not be further pressed—but he neither admitted or denied having to do with that transaction. The other two, Lynch and Lewis, persisted in their innocence of the crime for which they suffered; but admitted that they were concerned in many other robberies and outrages. The Clergymen in attendance exhorted the unfortunate men to call upon the country people to give up the arms in their possession, and to desist from their evil ways, which they did in most emphatic terms, delivered in Irish, which seemed to make a forcible impression upon the assembled multitude. Their bodies were brought into town on Thursday, and interred at the back of the old County Jail.

Thomas Deely, who gave important information of murderers previous to the Assizes, and who escaped on his way from the Court to the Crown-office, was retaken in the neighbourhood of Castletown, by a party of the Kenry Yeomen, on Wednesday, when on his way to surrender himself to John Waller, Esq. Since the murder of Neil, Deely had little hope of existence if he returned to his former companions, and though it more prudent to escape assassination—he was yesterday committed to Jail by Thomas Davenport, Esq.
