Yesterday, at two o'clock, Edmond Fitz-
Gerald, a school-master, for attacking the house
of Mr. Morgan, at Dunmoylan, and George
Walker, alias "Colonel Walker," for attacking

make balls, were taken from the County Jail to
Rathkeale, from whence they are to be conveyed
this day, to be hanged—the former at Shan-
golden, the latter at Newcastle. On leaving the
prison, they declared their innocence in the same
manner as those that previously suffered, though
convicted on the clearest and most satisfactory
testimony. Fitzgerald is the person who wrote
the letter to his insurgent friends in the country,
"to keep the boys quiet until after the Assizes."
John Kelly, who was also to be executed this
day, at Shanagolden, is respited.

William Dunworth, William Nunan, James
Callinan, and Patrick Nugent, (all comfortable
farmers,) for robbing a detachment of the 40th
Regiment of arms, which have since been surren-
dered, remain under sentence of death—to be
hanged at Ballygran on Saturday next.

Convictions at the County Galway Assizes.—
