On Thursday night, a notice, signed "General Rock," prescribing laws as to the regulation of land and houses, was posted near Sunville, in this County.

A few nights ago, a party of armed ruffians visited several houses on the lands of Carraghmore, near Faha-Pound, Co. Tipperary, and left notices with the inmates to quit their habitations on pain of death. One of the tenants, named Coyle, was very much ill-treated by the fellows. Thomas Brereton and Robert Cox, Esqrs. with a party of the 79th Highlanders, from Nenagh, proceeded on information on Friday night, and succeeded in apprehending Martin Brien, who is identified as being of the party.

Mr. Carroll, Chief Constable of the Police, stationed at Borrisoleigh, apprehended John Shanahan, James Shanahan, and Philip Rooke, for attacking John Coakley's house, a few nights ago, and demanding money and powder.

This day, Patrick Noonan, Thomas Sheehan, and William Duhigg, were hanged at the New Drop in front of the County Jail, pursuant to sentence at the last Assizes, for burglary, and rape on Ellen Hassett, near Newcastle—they all appeared penitent; the two former admitted the justice of their punishment, the latter denied having any knowledge of the transaction for which he was convicted.

This day, a respite was received for thirteen men under sentence of death in our County Jail—eight of them were convicted for attacking the Shanagolden Post-Office, the remainder for taking a gun from Adam Miller.

Yesterday, Mr. Lumsden, Chief Constable of Major Carter's Police, in the County Cork, arrived in this City, accompanied by Serjeant Jennings of the same Police, who both fully identified Robert Cussen, as the leader of the party who attacked Churchtown Barracks. We think it right to advert to this circumstance, as it was stated that Mr. Lumsden who saw Cussen in Gaol on Friday, could only swear as to the identity of him by belief. It however now appears that he is positive that Cussen was the leader; and Serjeant Jennings related several circumstances which occurred between him and Cussen on the night of the attack. Jennings who received a wound in the thigh states, that he owed his life on that occasion to Cussen's humanity. Mr. Lumsden was desperately wounded, and also acknowledges himself indebted to the interference of the unfortunate prisoner.

We are requested to say, that Cussen has been particularly examined by the Medical Officer of the gaol, who states that he has not any marks of wounds, as reported.
