Tipperary, and left ices with the inmates to quit their habitations pain of death. One of the tenants, named Coyle, was very much ill-treated by the fellows. Thomas Brereton and Robert Cox, Esqrs. with party of the 79th Highlanders, from Nenagh, proceeded on information on Friday night, and succeeded in apprehending Martin Brien, who identified as being of the party. Yesterday, Mr. Lumsden, Chief Constable of Major Carter's Police, in the County Cork, arrived in this City, accompanied by Serjeant Jennings of the same Police, who both fully identified Robert Cussen, as the leader of the party who attacked Churchtown Barracks. We think it right to advert to this circumstance, as it was stated that Mr. Lumsden who saw Cussen in Gaol on Friday, could only swear as to the identity of him by belief. It however now appears that he is positive that Cussen was the Jeader; and Serjeant Jennings related several camstances which occurred between him and Tassen on the night of the attack.
