**DEATHS.**

On Monday, the 6th inst. at Rutland-Square, Dublin, at a quarter past Eight o'clock, his Grace, the Right Hon and Honourable Charles Brodrick, D. D. Lord Archbishop of Cashel, Primate of Munster, and Lord Bishop of Emly. His Grace was translated to the Archepiscopacy in 1801 — He was consecrated Bishop of Clonfert in 1795, and Bishop of Kilmore in the succeeding year. His Grace was brother to Lord Viscount Middleton, was a Commissioner of the Board of Education, a Treasurer to the Board of First Fruits, and a Vice-president of the Society for Discourteuing Vice. The piety of his Grace was exemplary, his learning profound, and he devoted his long and active life to the advancement of religious knowledge, and the moral welfare of Society.
