At two o'clock, on Monday morning, John O'Halloran and Richard Allen, jun. farmers, residing at Coonagh, in the North Liberties, having had a dispute, the former struck and knocked down the latter, which caused him to take to his bed, and he died yesterday. The Mayor held an inquest on the body, when the Jury brought in the following verdict: "We find that the above Richard Allen, came to his death, on the 24th day of May, inst. at Nicholas-street, in this City, in consequence of a beating given him by John Halloran, on the 20th May, instant."

The Directors-General of Inland Navigation have intimated to the Lord Bishop, that they have directed their Engineer to ascertain what works are necessary on the line of navigation, so as to give immediate employment to the poor of Limerick—we therefore hope that the Canal bank, which is most desirably situated as a promenade, may be put into thorough repair.

This morning, the *Phillips*, Blaney, from London, arrived in our harbour. She is laden with Potatoes and Herrings, consigned by a benevolent Lady to Messrs. Harvey and Sons, for distribution to the Poor of Limerick.

The Officers and privates of the 39th regiment, whose head quarters are at present in Tralee, have generously contributed a day's pay to the relief of the Irish Poor.

Through the munificence of the resident Gentry and Landholders in and about Kilmallock, 249 families, averaging five in each family, are prevented from starving by the distribution of Oatmeal to some at a very reduced price, to others gratis. The benevolent intention of the donors will, however, be frustrated, if the absentees will not come forward with liberal subscriptions, as the fund already subscribed, has been nearly exhausted. Major Leslie (per Rev. James Ellard,) has increased his subscription from £3 to £10.
