They then proceeded to the house of Cornelius
Daly, on the same lands, and, after making a
ferocious attack, breaking the windows, demolish-
ing the chimney, and attempting to set fire to
the house, they were repelled by Daly and his
sons.

On Saturday night, the house of a tenant of
Barry Gregg, Esq. within a mile of Buttevant,
was attacked by eleven armed men, and robbed
of money.

Monday morning, the men recited in our last,
whose sentence was mercifully commuted from
death to transportation, were sent off, under a
strong escort, to Cork.

On Monday morning, as James Fahy, of
Toureen, near Cahernarry, was tackling his
horse to a car, the animal took fright, and ran
off; Fahy having been entangled in the chains,
had his brains dashed out in a few minutes, and,
by continued plunging, the animal killed itself
also.

A poor man of the name of James Kelly, who
was shot in the arm, hip, and groin, on the 31st
March last, at the wood of Kilcash, County Tip-
perary, and who has ever since been under sur-
gical care at the House of Industry at Clonmel,
where he underwent amputation of the arm, died
there on Monday night, from the effects of his
wounds.

The most awful Thunder and Lightning ever
recollected, occurred in this City on Monday
night and continued until a late hour yesterday
morning, torrents of rain followed the Thunder
---the only ill consequence we have heard is
that a house at Kilrush was nearly des-
troyed by the lightning and that several of
the inmates were scorched most severely.
