A dreadful attempt was made to assassinate
Mr. O'Brien (late of the County Limerick,) at
his new residence, near Caher, on Sunday night,
by a desperate gang, who fired several shots,
which wounded Mr. O'B. Mr. Cavendish and
a party of the 10th Hussars, under Earl Wiltshire,
followed the perpetrators, but without effect.
Thursday night, an unnatural murder was
perpetrated in the town of Newmarket, County
Cork, by a young woman, on her infant babe,
which was discovered in a ditch the next morn-
ing—the unfortunate wretch who committed
the act is in Jail.
Morty Donovan was on Monday apprehended
in Clonmel, by the Police, and is committed to
Jail, under warrant of Joseph Gubbins, Esq. for
the murder of Patrick Downes, at the fair of
Hospital.
Patrick Kagney, for murder, was taken, after
a long pursuit, on Tuesday night, by Mr. Beere
and two others, and lodged in Clonmel Jail.
Eight highway robberies have been committed
in the suburbs of the City of Cork, within a short
time. Captain Butler was, on Thursday night,
robbed and ill-used, on the Glanmire road, and
Mr. Fuller robbed on Friday night, at Sunday's-
well.
Yesterday, Thos. P. Vokes, Esq. got the ring
