SATURDAY, AUGUST 10.

This day, Jeremiah Rorke, was executed at the drop of the Jail, for attempting to assassinate Robert H. Ievers, Esq. a Magistrate of this County.

About the hour of one o'clock on the night of Sunday last, a band of ruffians assaulted the house of Hardingville, the residence of Christopher Harding, Esq. within a mile and a-half of Dromcolloher, in this County, and endeavoured, with a sledge and other instruments, to burst in the back door. The family started up on the first alarm, and were soon prepared for resistance—having so far shattered the door as to obtain a view of the preparations made to oppose them, and finding the defenders more numerous than they expected, they made off; there were no fire arms in the house, or they probably would have cause to repent their atrocious design.

It is a melancholy consideration, that notwithstanding the examples just made, these obstinate and abandoned wretches will still persevere in braving the Laws—and no man in the Country can promise to himself that, when he lies down at night, he can sleep in peace and security in his bed.

Last night, eleven sheep, the property of Mr. Thomas Ryan, of Cross, near Cluggin, in this County, were maliciously killed, and the fat only taken away.

On Tuesday night, a valuable milch cow, the property of an honest poor farmer, residing on the farm of Ballintubred, near Newcastle, was maliciously killed, by having received several stabs of a sharp-pointed instrument from some evil disposed persons, which perforated the body and neck.

Same night, a large rick of turf, the property of a dog-teacher, named Lynch, was set fire to and consumed to ashes, on the mountain of Glenquin.

On Saturday night a large quantity of turf belonging to Lieut. Purdon, an half-pay officer, residing in Newmarket, Co. Cork, was maliciously set on fire, and the entire consumed. This Gentleman had interested himself in quelling the late disturbances in that county, which is the only reason that can be assigned for this outrage.

Numerous notices have been posted within the last few days throughout the entire barony of Duhallow, County Cork, and surrounding country, signed "Captain Kilproctor," forbidding the payment of Tythes, and denouncing vengeance against any persons who disobey his orders.
